12. Respect for children's views

Children have the right to give their opinions freely on issues that affect them. Adults should listen and take children seriously.



What is the pupil council?

- Pupil Council is made up of one child from each class throughout the school
- These children are called “Class Representatives” or reps
- Class reps are voted in by their classmates – the person with the most votes is the winner
- They meet once a month with Mrs Palmer to discuss matters to do



What do the class
reps do?

- Class reps are given time in class to listen to the views and ideas of their classmates about how to improve our school
- Class reps write these ideas down and bring the ideas to our monthly meetings
- At the meetings the class reps get a chance to talk about the problems or ideas they and their classmates have
- Class reps get time in class to say what happened at the meeting



What makes a good class rep?

- Good listener
- Be able to talk in front of a group
- Work well with others
- Want to make a difference
