

Research

Read a book or find a web page to learn about a country you are interested in. Make notes under the headings: population, cities, physical features and climate.

Technologies

Design a futuristic vehicle for a journey to Mars. Label three unique features that help it travel. Have a go at building a model of your design using recycled materials.

Area

Robot Build

Draw a robot using only squares and rectangles on grid paper. Calculate the total area of the robot.

Coin Cover

Estimate how many 2p coins are needed to cover a smartphone screen. Test it and count.

Creativity

The Scribble Art Game

Ask someone to draw a random messy scribble line on a page. Turn it into a recognisable picture or creature.

New Product Invention

Find an ordinary household object. Sketch it with three completely new, exciting features.

Handwriting

Use lined paper and practise joining your letters correctly. Remember- we do not write in capital letters. You could copy out a poem, a paragraph from your favourite book or song lyrics.

French

Practise some French classroom instructions, pause the video to learn how to write them too!

Addition and Subtraction

Try rolling a dice to make a 3/4 – digit number. Can you add and subtract 1, 10, 100 and 1000 from each number you make? Challenge- can you do this with 5- or 6- digit numbers?

Art

Use pencil, coloured pencil, paint, chalk or oil pastels to draw a realistic landscape of somewhere you'd love to visit. Find inspiration by searching online. Try to include as much detail as possible.

Writing

Write a short adventure story about a journey. Maybe you visit a fictional land, outer space, or the deep ocean. Focus on descriptive language. Include a clear beginning, middle, and end.

Poster Design

A poster telling the P1's how to be a good friend. Remember they can't read lots of words, so we need lots of pictures and short sentences.
