Please can you make robust arrangements for your child and where they are to go at the end of the day as this is taking a significant toll on the capacity of the office staff.

Milk booking

Bus passes

Please continue to apply for bus passes through the library next door to Balgreen Primary. We would actively encourage you to apply for a pass for your child as this reduces the cost of any trips your child takes part in. Applying for them is fairly easy so please support us by applying for your pass now.

Security

We have asked pupils not to open the front door for adults when they come to the front door. This may seem rude to you but allows us to ensure we are managing visitors once they have entered the school building. The office staff are not always in the office as they are often called to other tasks around the school. All visitors to the school should sign in to the visitor book that is on the table beside the trophy cabinet.

Road Safety

At an assembly last week Mr Napier spoke to the children about being safe when crossing the road. We had a concern raised by a member of our community about pupils running across the road beside the island next to the tunnel. Please make sure your child is safe and crosses the road using the lights or the crossing officers who are there to ensure pupils are safe as they arrive and leave school. We would hate for any of our children to be involved in an accident.

Basketball

Basketball is a sport that has a high profile amongst our children here at Balgreen. We teach it through PE, as well as offering it to pupils as part of their break and lunchtime. During the February break we had several new boards installed so pupils have access to more hoops to show off their skills.
