Reading

Please encourage your child to read for pleasure and/or purpose. It doesn't always have to be a book - it can be a magazine, instructions for a game or how to build something, a shopping list or ingredients for a recipe. The options are endless!

Health and Wellbeing/Outdoor Learning

1. Take part in the RSPB 'Big Garden Birdwatch' between Friday 26th and Sunday 28th January. All you need is a garden or park and 1 hour of your time. 2. Look at a selection of food labels from your fridge/cupboard. Can you find all the important information e.g. ingredients, quantities, origin, etc? Discuss how healthy the products are and what it was about the label that attracted you to the product.

Expressive Art/Technology

We are undertaking an enterprise project to fundraise for a class treat and will look at how advertisements influence what people do, feel and buy.

Take your most favourite thing - toy, game, piece of clothing and create an advertisement for it. Can you make people love it as much as you do?

It could be a poster advertisement, digital poster advertisement or even a recorded advertisement.

'The Big 6' world religions are Christianity, Judaism, Islam, Hinduism, Sikhism and Buddhism. Choose one of these or another world religion that we haven't yet looked at in class and learn all about the key beliefs and an important festival they celebrate.

Record your findings in a poster, leaflet or PowerPoint to share with the class.

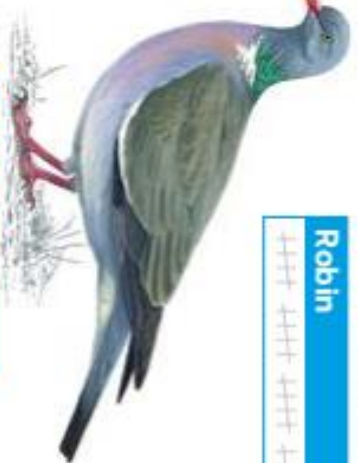
