Writing-Myths mini topic

Choose a culture or civilisation from around the world (Greek, Norse, African, Native American etc.). Research and discover a myth or a legend that captures your imagination. Do some note taking. Outline the main events of the myth/legend. Introduce a modern twist or change the course of events. Write a short story based on your adapted myth legend.

Bonus Challenge: Imagine your myth or legend is part of a collection. Design a book cover and include a brief blurb that entices readers to explore the magical world you've created.

The pieces of fruit are put into boxes with an equal number of pears or oranges in each box.

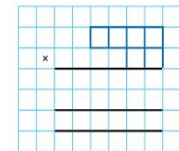
Tiny: There will be 8 pieces of fruit in each box.
