Then be the teacher and uplevel your sentence by adding: **adjectives, adverbs and conjunctions by linking more ideas.**

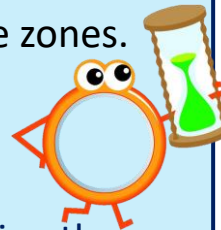
Challenge: Rewrite your sentence as a question using a question mark (?)

- Practice telling the time using quarter past, quarter to and half past. **Challenge: tell it to the exact minute.**
- Time around the world: Look up the time in other time zones. **Challenge: How many hours ahead/behind are they?**
- Make a timeline of your day. Remember to include the time, activities and whether it is **am** or **pm**. **Challenge: Draw an analogue clock next to each, showing the time you begin each activity.**
- Using a stopwatch, time how many times you can do the following things in 1 minute: write your name, hop on one foot, do star jumps. **Challenge: Predict how many you think you will do.**
